

her success. After the Affordable Care Act was signed into law, a number of insurance agencies decided to stop selling health insurance rather than learn the new regulations. "Kristin stood to lose revenue as some insurers stopped paying commission and as the expanded option for people to use an online marketplace shifted business away from licensed agents," the nominator wrote. Manwaring opted to focus the agency on helping to educate people about the market and aims to do what best serves clients.

Jim Franklin is one of the people who works silently to support various good deeds, wrote a nominator. "Jim is one of the true volunteers that fall into the positive side of the 80/20 group, where 20 percent of the helpers do 80 percent of the work," she said.

The nominator said she's watched Franklin in action at the United Good Neighbors and has watched how he worked with winners of the local Elks scholarship

With these deeds in mind, we asked them, what does leadership mean to you and what kind of leadership do you think Jefferson County needs? In their own words:

"In being asked what leadership means to me there are many words and thoughts that come to mind. Leadership is a collaborative team effort that goes beyond the person or a title. Leadership is about building trust in community, both within and outside an organization, being mindful, having faith and nurturing your tribe." - Kristin Manwaring

"It is most difficult to define in a few words what it takes to be a leader, as characteristics and combinations vary so widely," said Jim. "We have all met various personality types who display a number of strong qualities in different combinations from others. but the basis includes many of the following: intelligence, courage, accountability, responsibility, passion, as well as being a role model, a motivator and a visionary. However, the cornerstone of all good leaders is built on INTEGRITY. Without integrity, those other qualities fail to achieve as much success. Jack Welch, former CEO of General Electric, once said. 'A leader's job is to look into the future and see the organization

not as it is but as it should be. This could well serve as a mantra for the leader of a small community such as ours." - Jim Franklin

Two qualities of leadership that appear in both responses are passion and integrity. Merriam-Webster defines passion as an intense, driving, or overmastering feeling or conviction, and integrity as a firm adherence to a code of especially moral or artistic values; incorruptibility.

These definitions exemplify

Our moral and artistic values are supported by community members like these two, who labor for what they believe to be best, not for recognition. 


