

RISEING ENTREPRENEUR

Horus Horizon Marine is an independent marine trades business established in 2021. While considering business names, owner Lou Geraghty realized that "Horus" (the ancient Egyptian deity and their personal and occupational guardian) paired with the expansive sense of the word "Horizon" was a fitting name for their new venture.

Lou's skillset is broad, experience-based, and enhanced by formal education. A transplant from New York State, Lou shares a love for mechanics with their master mechanic father. Discovering that a wrench could be as big as then 4-year-old Lou, inspired their inquisitive mind to learn more about the uses of tools. While working as a teen at an auto shop, a client offered extra work in property management where Lou mastered painting and repairs. Soon a full-time gig, this led to summer stints varnishing boats. By their early 20's, Lou excelled at inventory, working as a lube-tech and mechanic, a service writer assessing jobs, ordering, estimating & billing, and managing paint crews while maintaining workflow for customer satisfaction.

The idea to go to boat school presented itself at

Connecticut's Mystic Boat Show one summer. After extensive research, the NW School for Woodenboat Building "felt right". Lou arrived to a warm welcome. Once the full boat building and systems courses were completed, Lou worked various jobs in Boat Haven, Port Townsend. Since establishing Horus Horizon Marine, Lou, now independent, often collaborates with others on a variety of mostly wooden boat projects. "I am willing to take on intimidating projects and I know I can figure it out. I have a good community to ask for help if I need to.

It all comes really naturally to me and I love to do it." Projects include woodworking, finishing, and systems. Mechanical systems are Lou's first love but building with wood brings as much joy and is a skill Lou continues to grow. "The boats talk to me," Lou chuckles, "I make a plan, note the weather and goals for the day, select some good music, fall into the flow, and it becomes meditative."

Coming up through the trades has always been a struggle for me as fem-bodied but who comes across as masculine. There has been support and push-back. I just want to work alongside others and learn." Lou identifies as non-binary (They, Them). "I have always been this person, but it has become more important to me to identify openly now that I feel safe in my community


and have developed a network of people who support me on my journey."

Whether working in the trades, as an artist, or competing in downhill bicycle racing, Lou says, "I am OK being that person who raises a hand and says this is who I am if it can help others be the beautiful people they are with confidence". Lou's core mission? "I do the best job I can in a timely fashion, and keep people informed and included in the process.

I'd also like to teach someone just coming into the trades so I can pass on these skills the way others taught me."


Jumping Mouse Children's Center


